- **Step 4: Cleaning the Rabbet:** The recess where the glass sits (the rabbet) is completely cleaned up and coated with linseed oil or guide to avoid the wood from drawing moisture out of the new putty.
- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is laid down, the brand-new glass is pressed carefully into place, and glazier's points are driven in to secure it.
- **Action 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A cool triangle of putty is applied around the boundary of the glass, ravelled, and left to treat before painting.
