1. **Set a Budget**-- Determine a quantity you can pay for to lose without impacting necessary expenses. Treat this as home entertainment cash.
2. **Divide the Bankroll**-- Allocate a portion for each gaming session and do not surpass it. A typical split is 5-- 10% of the total bankroll per session.
3. **Track Performance**-- Keep a record of bets, results, and cash-out points. Routine evaluation helps identify patterns of excessive threat.
