

The first time I helped a next-door neighbor set up a sprinkler system, we set aside one weekend. We finished on the 3rd, aching, sunburned, and a little humbled. The system worked, although we spent the following month dialing in head positioning, fixing little leakages, and discovering why water pressure on paper does not constantly match what comes out of a trench line after 8 tees and an increase in quality. That experience educated me a truth I have seen over and over: when it involves sprinkler installment, design choices made on the first day echo for many years, in water expenses, in plant health, and in how often you discover yourself down in the dirt doing lawn sprinkler repair.

This is not a scare piece. A lot of home owners construct reliable, durable systems and take pride in the results.
