

Burlington, Massachusetts, does not usually announce itself with a single dramatic landmark. What it offers instead is a practical, well-kept suburban town with enough going on to reward people who look beyond the main roads. Visitors often come here for a meeting, a weekend stay near the mall district, or a quick stop between Boston and the Merrimack Valley. That is the easy version of Burlington.
