

For Los Angeles homeowners, the usual garage door repair cost is a regional estimate rather than a firm rate. A small adjustment may cost less than a major repair involving a broken spring, damaged garage door panel, failed garage door opener, or bent garage door track. Area, part quality, access, urgency, and the condition of the overhead garage door all affect the final invoice.

Garage Door Spring Replacement Pricing

A garage door spring supports much of the door's weight, so spring work should be handled by a qualified professional. Never attempt to unwind or replace a torsion spring or extension spring without specialized equipment and training. Stored spring tension can cause severe injuries.

Garage Door Panel and Track Repair Prices

A damaged garage door panel may result from a vehicle impact, wind, moisture, or years of use. Replacing one garage door panel or door section may cost approximately \$300 to \$1,000, depending on whether the exact design and finish are still available. Matching a discontinued color, window pattern, insulation level, or door material can make a single-section repair more complicated.

A slight dent may be repairable, but a twisted section, damaged reinforcement, or damaged hinges may need replacement. If the garage door panel is part of a custom or older system, the technician may recommend comparing the price of a replacement section with a new garage door.

Garage door track problems can include loose fasteners, bent vertical tracks, damaged horizontal sections, poor spacing, or a door that has shifted out of alignment. Track alignment and minor adjustment may cost approximately \$125 to \$350. Replacing a damaged garage door track or related hardware may cost about \$250 to \$700, depending on the door’s size and configuration.

A worn garage door roller can cause shaking, scraping, or uneven movement. Roller replacement may range from approximately \$150 to \$400 for a residential door, with premium nylon rollers costing more than basic units. The technician should inspect hinges, brackets, cables, and the track before fitting new rollers. Replacing one visibly damaged part without correcting the underlying alignment may result in another failure.

Garage Door Opener Repair and Installation Cost

A garage door opener may fail because of a worn drive system, damaged gear, faulty circuit board, weak motor, bad safety sensor, or broken remote control. Garage door opener repair commonly ranges from approximately \$150 to \$450, depending on the failed component and whether replacement parts remain available.

Simple issues, such as configuring a remote control, replacing batteries, adjusting travel limits, or aligning safety sensors, may be less expensive. A failed motor or control board can make repair less practical, particularly on an older unit without readily available replacement parts.

The garage door opener installation cost for a new residential unit often falls between approximately \$350 and \$900, including standard labor. Heavy doors, high ceilings, unusual mounting conditions, battery backup, advanced security features, and additional remotes can increase the price. A smart garage door opener may cost more initially but can provide app control, activity alerts, and compatibility with a home automation system.

Prior to authorizing garage door opener installation, verify whether the price includes installation brackets, assembly of the rail, protective sensors, system programming, remote transmitters, disposal of the old opener, and testing. Garage door opener repair should also include an inspection that the door itself is well balanced. An opener should not be used to make up for a door with spring problems.

Garage Door Repair vs. Replacement Cost
