In Philadelphia, I have actually seen more flooded basements at 2 a.m. Than at any sensible hour of the workday. Old real estate stock, narrow rowhomes, shared sewer lines, and winter season temperature level swings all make pipes here a little bit more unforgiving than in numerous other cities.

5. Take clear images or short videos of the damage and the source of the leakage for insurance coverage and for the plumber.

If you smell gas, the process is various. Do not turn switches, do not use lighters, and do not stay in the building. Get everybody out, move a safe distance away, and call 911 or the gas utility emergency line. Only after the gas
