- **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade 10 skins of a particular wear tier for one skin of the next greater tier.

### Comprehending Skin Wear and Rarities

Not all skins are developed equal. The visual quality and market price of a skin depend heavily on two primary aspects: **Rarity** [cs2skin.com](#) and **Wear Condition**.

#### Weapon Rarities

Rarity determines the standard drop rate of a skin. Valve utilizes a color-coded tier system to classify products:



Color Code Rarity Tier Description **Blue** Customer/ Industrial/ Mil-Spec The most common tier. Normally makes up the bulk of random drops and lower-tier case contents. **Purple** Limited Uncommon skins with more elaborate designs. **Pink** Categorized Uncommon skins that are greatly searched for by collectors. **Red** Covert Exceptionally uncommon weapons. The majority of iconic rifle skins fall into this category. **Gold/ Special** Amazing The rarest tier, specifically reserved for knives and unusual glove versions.

## Wear Conditions (Float Values)

Every skin is assigned a floating-point number between 0.00 and 1.00, referred to as the **Float Value**. This number identifies how worn or scratched the weapon appears.

Wear Condition Float Value Range Visual Appearance **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, flawless surface with very little to no scratches. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Small acnes or scratches, typically near the edges. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable wear and tear, but the artwork remains largely undamaged. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable scratches and dulling of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly used, rusted, or scraped. (Note: Some specific skins look purposefully cool when battle-scarred, making the nickname "Blackimov").

## The Virtual Economy: Why Are Skins So Expensive?

To an outsider, spending hundreds or even thousands of dollars on a digital gun texture seems ridiculous. Nevertheless, the CS: GO skin economy operates on core economic principles of supply and demand, shortage, and energy (social status).

### Elements Influencing Skin Prices:

1. **Supply and Demand:** If a case is discontinued, the supply of its skins stops growing. As the player base expands, need increases, driving costs up.
2. **Drift and Pattern Templates:** Some skins feature algorithmic patterns. For example, the *AK-47|Case Hardened* has different quantities of blue coloring depending on its pattern index. A "Blue Gem" pattern can command astronomical rates.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When an expert player utilizes a particular skin during a major competition, demand for that skin often spikes over night.
4. **Sticker labels and Souvenirs:** Applying expert tournament sticker labels to a weapon or owning a souvenir package from a Major can dramatically change its worth.

- **StatTrak™ M4A4|Howl:** Due to a copyright issue, this skin was pulled from drop pools early in its life, making it exceptionally rare and valuable.
