- **Nonce:** A number that increments with every bet placed.

Before the round begins, the gamer receives a hashed variation of the server seed. After the round concludes, the server seed is exposed, allowing the player to independently validate that the crash point was predetermined and not modified mid-flight.

2. The Anti-Martingale (Paroli) Strategy

3. Low Multiplier Auto-Cashout
