3. Drop Rates and Probabilities

The official drop probabilities (as published by Valve) for each rarity in a standard CS2 case are:

Rarity	Approximate Drop Rate
Mil-Spec (Blue)	79.92%
Restricted (Purple)	15.98%
Classified (Pink)	3.20%
Covert (Red)	0.64%
Rare Special Item (Gold)	-- Knife 0.25%

Thus, typically, **1 out of every 400 openings** yields a knife (or glove) skin. The exact knife model (e.g., Bayonet vs. Karambit) is selected from a pool of readily available knives for that case, each similarly [cs2 cases](#) likely within

the Rare Special Item tier.

4. Typical Knives and Market Values

Below is a list of the most sought-after knives, together with their average market value (as of early 2026). Rates can differ dramatically based upon float, stattrak, and phase.

Pointer: Float values listed below 0.02 (Factory New) typically command a 30-50% premium over battle-scarred counterparts.

5. Techniques for Responsible Knife Opening

5.1. Set a Budget

- **Decide ahead of time** how much you are prepared to invest on secrets, and stay with that limit.

- Use third-party trackers (e.g., CS GOStash, Buff163) to see price fluctuations.
- Buying a case when the market is saturated can decrease the resale rate of the resulting skin.

- During significant sales (e.g., Steam Summer Sale) keys may be marked down.
- Some third-party websites provide "complimentary" everyday cases-- use them to increase opening volume without additional cost.

5.5. Understand the Legal Landscape

- In numerous jurisdictions, opening loot boxes is restricted for minors. Guarantee compliance with local age regulations.
- Prevent grey-market sites that guarantee "ensured" knives; these frequently breach Valve's Terms of Service and can cause account restrictions.

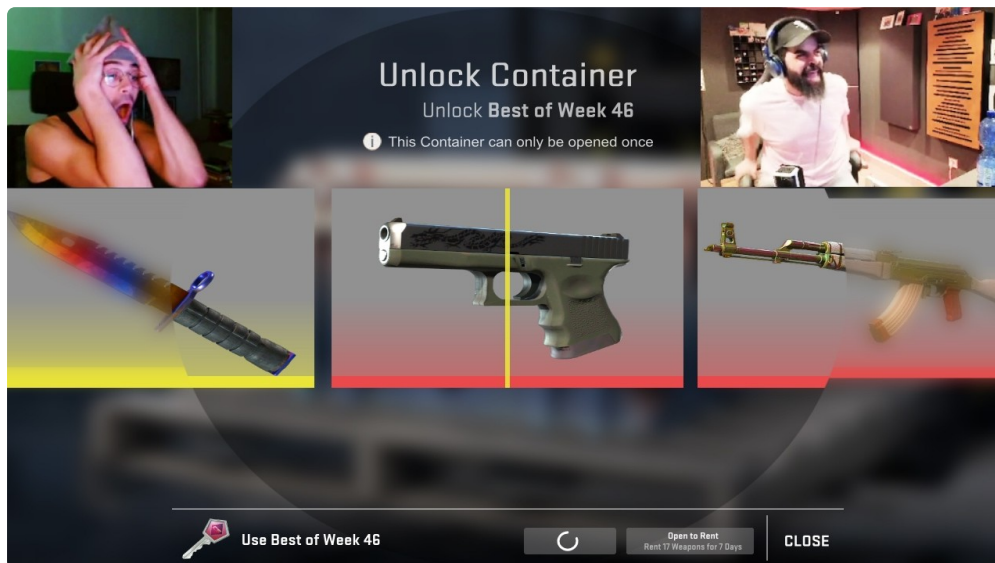
