The Five Exterior Wear Conditions

Wear Condition Drift Range Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine condition with little to no noticeable wear. Typically the most expensive tier. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Slight indications of wear, normally visible just on close evaluation or particular high-friction areas. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches and wear on the body and paintwork. The most common market tier. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable wear, fading colors, and popular scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or scraped. Some skins look totally various (and distinctively gritty) in this condition.

Loadouts in CS2 are categorized by weapon types, with [CSGO skins marketplace](#) players typically selecting a main rifle (AK-47 for Terrorists, M4A4 or M4A1-S for Counter-Terrorists), a sniper rifle (AWP), and sidearms.
