- **Step 4: Cleaning the Rabbet:** The recess where the glass sits (the rabbet) is thoroughly cleaned and covered with linseed oil or primer to avoid the wood from drawing wetness out of the new putty.
- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is set, the new glass is pressed carefully into location, and glazier's points are driven in to protect it.
- **Step 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A neat triangle of putty is applied around the boundary of the glass, ravelled, and left to treat before painting.
