Coinflip	A simple 1v1 PvP video game where two players wager skins of roughly equal worth. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 odds, minus a small platform commission (rake).	
Prize	Numerous players contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's value identifies the player's "ticket" share. A spinner picks one winner who takes everything. Based upon the overall worth contributed; platform takes a portion cost.
