- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00

Some skins look extraordinary even at greater wear worths, while others look greatly damaged. Understanding how float worths impact price is vital if you plan to trade or offer your unboxed products.

3. Think About Buying Directly
