Armor and Protection

In *Rust*, security is the distinction between brushing off a gunshot and heading back to the beach. Armor worths on the wiki are calculated based on physical security, projectile protection, and radiation resistance.

Common Armor Sets

- **Burlap/ Leather Set:** Early video game defense; easy to craft, provides minimal defense against guns, but good versus cold and wildlife.
- **Roadway Sign/ Wolf Headdress Set:** Mid-game meta. Balances movement speed with reputable bullet defense.
- **Metal Facemask/ Metal Chest Plate:** The gold requirement for late-game PvP. Integrated with a hoodie and pants, this set provides optimal protection versus raids and roaming teams.

Raiding Tools and Explosives

If developing a fortress is half the battle, taking apart somebody else's is the other half. The Rust Items Wiki provides accurate explosive calculations, assisting raiding celebrations determine the number of resources they need to breach a base's honeycomb walls.



- **Pouch Charges:** Unreliable, unstable, however cheap for mid-game raids.
- **Timed Explosive Charge (C4):** The timeless, trusted base-destroyer. Deals massive localized damage.
- **Explosive 5.56 Rifle Ammo:** Fired from a silenced rifle, this method is quieter and enables precise splash damage on doors and walls.
- **Rocket Launcher:** Uses Rocket, High Velocity Rocket, or Incendiary Rocket ammo for ravaging splash damage.
