3. CoinFlip

CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) video game mode. Two gamers wager skins of approximately equal monetary worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot, minus a little commission (house edge) taken by the site.

4. Jackpot

In a Jackpot video game, numerous gamers toss skins into a central pot. Each skin adds to the gamer's overall portion chance of winning the whole pot (based upon the dollar value of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one fortunate gamer takes home all the deposited skins.
