

A lost key, a broken fob, or a locked car can turn an ordinary day in Orlando into a long wait. 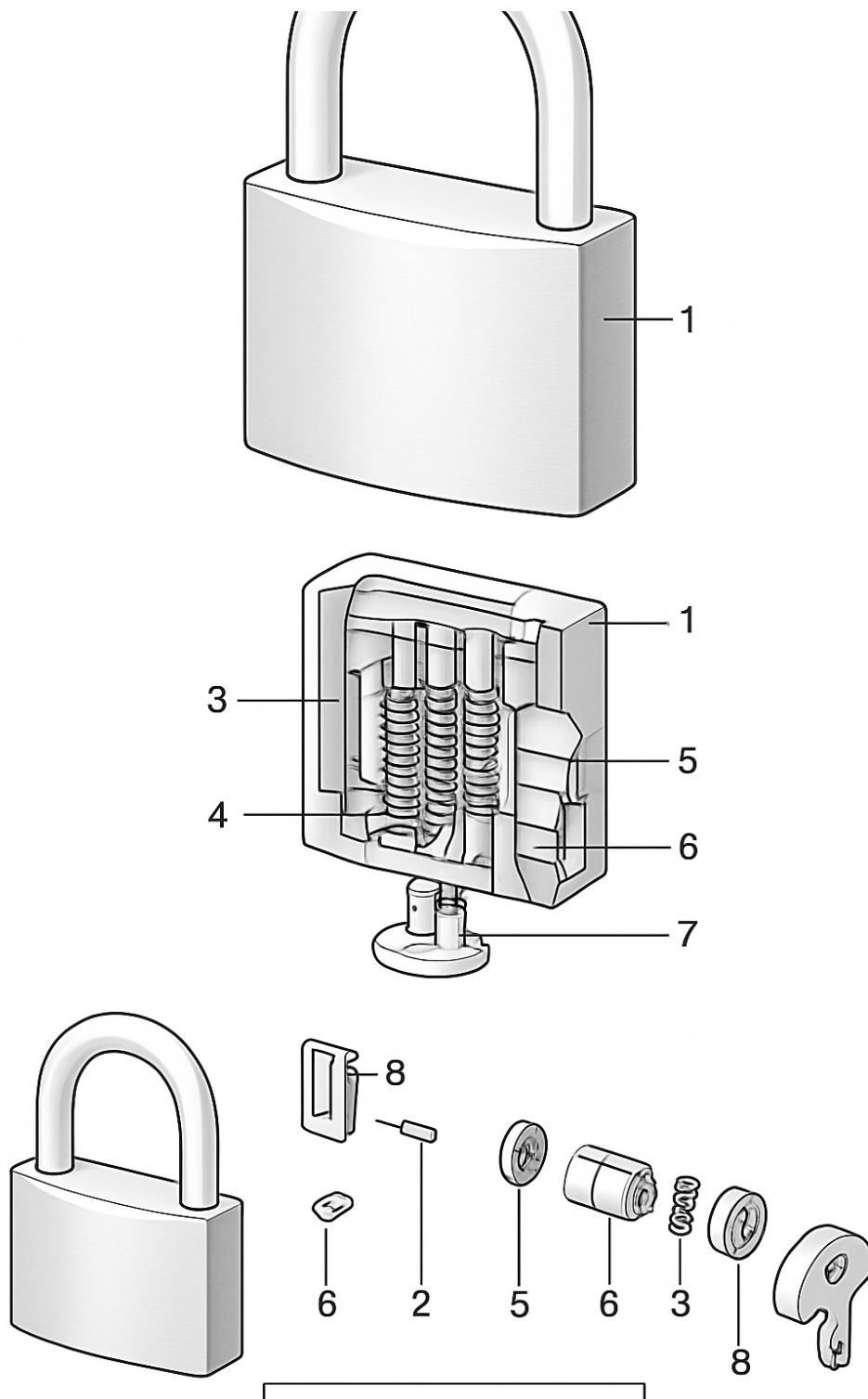
