The Economics of Case Openings

The CS: GO/CS2 economy works likewise to a real-world stock exchange. Rates are governed purely by supply and demand.

- **The Active Drop Pool vs. Rare Drop Pool:** When a case is transferred to the "Rare Drop Pool" (ceased active drop), its supply stops increasing naturally. As a result, as gamers open them with time, the staying supply diminishes, and the cost of the case frequently increases.
- **Drift Values and Wear:** Every skin is appointed a float value ranging from 0.00 to 1.00, determining its condition (Factory New, Minimal Wear, Field-Tested, Well-Worn, and Battle-Scarred).
- **The Trade-Up Contract:** Players can trade 10 skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next higher tier, offering a secondary usage for unwanted, low-tier case drops.

Most skilled players recommend buying particular skins directly from the Steam Community Market or third-party marketplaces instead of betting on case openings.

How do I get cases free of charge?

Gamers can earn passive case drops just by using official or community servers with VAC protected. Weekly care plans usually allow players to pick specific items, including active-pool weapon cases, simply by leveling up their profile when per week.

CS: GO cases are much more than easy loot boxes-- they represent a deeply integrated cultural and economic pillar of the Counter-Strike franchise.
